- III. The strategic direction of BLC -large group discussion
 - a. Val Sundby, topics that could benefit from BLC workgroup input:
 - i. No system for regular check-ins.
 - ii. Creating a policy/practice for programs going on hiatus.
 - iii. Ongoing quality rubric/standards, as a system 'get ahead of the work.
 - iv. Rigor, what do we mean when we talk about rigor?
 - v. As programs shift & change
 - Common course numbers
 - Course sharing
 - vi. Questions:
 - What does this group look like?
 - Was there a group already created around academic rigor?
 - a. Yes, it was shelved due to concerns about academic freedom. How each school defines this.
 - b. Possibility of tying this work to the centers of excellence.
 - c. Peninsula- what is considered rigor at four years is different from what employers want when looking at the training of individuals.
 - vii. Possible use of a Development of Curriculum (DACUM) style event.
 - Hold with industry partners.
 - Develop a list to help guide programs.
 - An ongoing process with advisory committees.
 - a. Will only work with engaged advisory committee members.
 - viii. Additional conversations:
 - $\frac{1}{3}$ of students currently entering BAS programs are coming from DTA.
 - a. Creating pathways for students from other areas is important, but should be an exception, not a rule.

- b. Must focus on marketing the 2+2, otherwise problematic with four-year institutions. Advertising to DTA students would draw scrutiny, regardless of intent.
 - c. Being mindful and keeping with the spirit of the legislation.
 - d. Most students are local.
 - e. Tacoma is focusing on how BAS degrees are different.
 - Question: How are people building the Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS)? Is this 2+2, direct entry?
 - a. App. connect creating a model.
 - b. South and Central Seattle currently have a model.
 - c. This degree is logic-based, not calculus.
 - Question: Can students with 60 credits enter a BAS program?
 - a. No, must have 90 credits.
 - b. Financial Aid approval process for BAS students.
 - A potential area for workgroup- this could be a standing policy workgroup.
 - a. Clarifying language.
 - i. ex. Can be accepted at xx credits.
 - ii. Can take upper-level courses once xx number of credits have been completed.
 - iii. Once the codified language is settled, take to Instruction Commission (IC).
 - iv. F.A. Issues:
 - 1. how to have pre-reqs covered by F.A.
 - 2. How to admit students, currently both conditional vs. provisional acceptance language is being used.
 - v. Feedback from IC about workgroup.
 - 1. Who is the liaison?
 - 2. Thinking of drafting policies and getting IC input/approval
 - 3. Create a plan with a timeline and due dates.

- a. The legislative session ends on Sunday.
 - i. No new priorities.
 - ii. It was a good year for community colleges.
 - There was a president, trustee, or student present each day of the session.
 - This year there were three legislative interns.
 - iii. Single bill for freshman entry BSN
 - Pilot degrees
 - This did not make it through, there was pushback from four-year institutions about freshman entry programs.
 - Will be revisited next session.
- b. A larger nursing bill did pass.
 - i. Online LPN.
 - ii. The expectation of a wage study.
 - iii. Simulation hrs. equivalent for clinical hours allowable is now a statute.
- c. The search for a new deputy director of education is currently underway.
- d. Council structure in the system:
 - i. Many new people.

 - iii. Shows where councils overlap, and can help determine which groups would be a good match for shared work.

 - i. Fraudulent Applications – a landing page and guidance document will be published by late April.

- ii. The Career and Employment Services Council has been discontinued; work will continue in other spaces.
 - iii. Support for Students Experiencing Homeless – 28 colleges participated in the pilot and served 2,227 students. The bill to expand this work is on its way to the Governor’s Office for signature.
 - iv. Student Conduct Academy – The Student Services Commission is developing training for staff and students with a formal role in conduct proceedings.
 - f. Basic Education for Adults
 - i. Alternatives to testing.
 - SBCTC and members from the Council for Basic Skills (CBS) presented in Atlanta, which was well received.
 - ii. SBCTC responded to the Department of Corrections (DOC) requesting information to start new Prison Education programs.
 - g. Dual Credit
 - i. If your college has started a new College in the High School program during 2022-23 or will be starting one during 2023-24 notify Jamie Traugott jtraugott@sbctc.edu for a record update.
 - ii. Upcoming NACEP summer accreditation Institute July 19-20.
 - iii. Running Start funding for 2023 has been reallocated. OPSI ESSER funds now cannot fund students for summer 2023.
 - h. Transfer Education
 - i. BSCS funds have been allocated to 15 colleges.
 - ii. Climate Solutions, work of faculty leads kicked off in January. this work focuses on integrating climate justice into transfer curriculum.
 - iii. New Computer Science transfer degree
 - Joint transfer council is still seeking input on proposed Associate of Science Transfer- Track 3 (AST-3).
