MARTIN HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION DEADLINE: JULY 6, 2018

- The Martin Honors opportunity enables community college students of exceptional ability and outstanding achievements to complete their baccalaureate degrees at the UW-Seattle. Students are expected to have well-formulated ideas about the direction of future studies and subsequent careers.
- Applicants for the 2018 Martin Honors Scholarship should plan to transfer to UW-Seattle in summer 2018, fall 2018, or winter 2019.
- Martin Family Honors Scholars receive up to \$12,000 per year for up to three years of undergraduate studies at UW-Seattle.

MARTIN ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

APPLICATION DEADLINE: APRIL 2019

- The Martin Achievement opportunity is designed to encourage and assist students early in their community college careers to pursue the baccalaureate at UW-Seattle after completing their associate's degrees or transfer requirements for UW academic programs.
- Applicants for the 2019 Martin Achievement Scholarship should not plan to transfer to UW-Seattle prior to summer 2020.
- Martin Achievement Scholars receive \$5,000 in support for their second year in community college and up to \$12,000 per year for up to three years of undergraduate studies at UW-Seattle.

HONORS SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be:

- Washington State residents who are either U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or eligible for in-state tuition through HB 1079 qualification.
- Currently attending or have attended a community college in the state of Washington.
- Have earned a minimum of 36 credits at a Washington State Community College by the time they matriculate at the University of Washington. Students who hold an associate's degree are encouraged to apply.
- Washington State community college transfer students who are currently enrolled at UW may not have earned more than 18 UW credits by the application deadline.
- The award will depend on successful admission to University of Washington Seattle as a matriculated student.
- The selection committee gives no consideration to an applicant's gender, race, color, creed, or national origin.

ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be:

- Washington State residents who are either U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or eligible for in-state tuition through HB 1079 qualification.
- Currently enrolled students at Bellevue, Cascadia, Edmonds, Everett, Grays Harbor, Green River, Highline, North Seattle, Olympic, Peninsula, Pierce, Seattle Central, Shoreline, South Seattle or Tacoma Community College pursuing their first baccalaureate degree
- Have earned a minimum of 15 community college transfer credits
- Have demonstrated signs of exceptional ability in science, humanities, music, art, and/or leadership.
- The award will depend on successful admission to UW Seattle as a matriculated student.
- Applicants for the 2018 Martin Achievement Scholarship should not plan to transfer to the UW-Seattle prior to the summer 2019.
- The selection committee gives no consideration to an applicant's gender, race, color, creed, or national origin.

INTERVIEWS

HONORS SCHOLARSHIP: SEPTEMBER, 2018

- After the internal UW selection committee reviews all applications, a select number of applicants will be invited to UW-Seattle to interview with the Martin Family Foundation Board. After those interviews, final selection decisions will be made and all applicants will be notified.

ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP: MAY, 2019
