

CENSUS DATE REQUIREMENTS & LOCAL FLEXIBILITY

An overview of options for colleges, April 2024

This one-pager provides an overview of the complex landscape of the FAFSA simplification changes, and the funding challenges it presents to our community and technical colleges. This document seeks to:

- Highlight the importance of adhering to the census date requirements, as it directly impacts FTE calculations and other associated matters.
- Highlight areas of flexibility afforded to colleges through their exception policies and board of trustee decisions.
- Equip stakeholders with an understanding of the dynamics between regulatory mandates and institutional discretion to navigate enrollment, advising, business services, and financial aid complexities.

What is the Census Date?

- The census date of a class represents the time frame within which students must register or attend with intent to register for a class, to count for enrollment reporting. Full-time equivalent (FTE) is generated for any student enrolled as of the census date of the class. [Policy Manual-Chapter 5: SBCTC Enrollment Policy, Chapter 5.1, 5.2]
- See also section <u>5.40.10 Determining the quarter census date for regular session classes</u>
 - The quarter census date is based on the number of weeks in the quarter. If the quarter is 10 or 11 weeks, the census date is the tenth instructional day. If the quarter is 9 weeks, the census date is the ninth instructional day. If the quarter is 8 weeks, the census date is the eighth instructional day, etc.
- The census date is not the same as the tuition due date.

Statutes and Processes that Rely on the Census Date

- FTE calculations end of term snapshot is also captured
- Estimating Building Fee revenue for the next budget year end of term snapshot can be used
- Faculty contracts
- Federal and state reporting
- Data integrity for IPEDs, National Student Clearinghouse

Local Policy Flexibility

Colleges have varying degrees of local flexibility when it comes to shaping policies, with certain key areas allowing them to tailor their approaches to meet the unique needs of students and communities.

- Drop period
- Enrollment dates
- Waitlist timelines
- Refunds
- Payment plans
- Collections

Washington Administrative Code (WAC) & RCWs

WAC per college

Regulations of executive branch agencies are issued by authority of statutes. Like legislation and the Constitution, regulations are a source of primary law in Washington State. The <u>Washington Administrative</u> <u>Code (WAC)</u> codifies the regulations and arranges them by subject or agency.
