Non-Instructional Assessment

Technology-Supported Pathways

The college is implementing Watermark to align and simplify student planning tools, program maps, and advising systems.

Clark's "Penguin Path" defines six key milestones in the student journey and embeds career exploration throughout—from onboarding to completion. Real-world applications

UPDATES & RESEARCH

Tracking College Success / FYE Courses

We've been analyzing enrollment data for College Success / FYE courses across Washington's 34 CTCs using the SCOL course attribute. Early findings show:

- Strong adoption of SCOL-tagged courses in fall and winter terms
- Wide variation in course offerings across colleges
- Opportunities to use the data to evaluate persistence and retention
